






Autumn Tour and Driving Tests – Sunday 13th September 2009 Supplementary Regulations



At this year's Autumn Tour and Driving Tests, we will be exploring rural Cheshire, courtesy of our kind hosts James and Christine Peacop.

Based at the wonderful Mouldsworth Motor Museum mid-way between Chester and Northwich (MR 117/503704), the event will combine a Tour through the delightful Cheshire countryside with a few Driving Tests at different locations along the route. The Tests will be gentle on both car and brain, and will aim to provide stimulation without dizziness, as well as entertainment for driver and passengers alike!

There will be a lunch stop along the way at a local hotel; lunches can be pre-booked for those who would like them.

Back at the finish, there will be tea and cakes and the Section's Annual General Meeting. The Museum will also be open for you to have a look round – but be warned, the fascinating exhibits may keep you engrossed for hours!

The rough timetable for the day is as follows:

- Signing-on and scrutineering will open at 8.45 a.m.
- Cars will leave start from 10.15 a.m. and complete an opening test before following the route to the lunch halt
- After lunch, the route will continue to the next Driving Test venue, and from there back to a final test at the finish
- Cars will arrive back at the finish from around 4.00 p.m. onwards

Autumn Tour and Driving Tests – Sunday 13th September 2009 Supplementary Regulations

Announcement

The Light Car & Edwardian Section of the Vintage Sports Car Club Limited will organise a Certificate of Exemption Touring Assembly and Clubsport Permit Autotests on Sunday 13th September 2009. The event will start and finish at the Mouldsworth Motor Museum, Mouldsworth, Cheshire (MR117/503704).

Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (including the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.

Authorisation

MSA Certificate of Exemption (Tour) TBA
MSA Permit Number (Autotests) TBA

Eligibility

The event is open to all fully paid-up members of both the organising club and the Light Car & Edwardian Section, driving cars that are accepted by the Section.

Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering and Signing On will open at the start/finish venue at 8.45 a.m. on Sunday 13th September. Any competitor who has not passed Scrutineering / Signing On by 10.15 a.m. may be excluded. Cars will start from 10.15 a.m. by attempting a test at the start/finish venue, and then will follow the route instructions to proceed to a lunch halt. After the lunch halt, they will then proceed to the next Autotest venue, where further tests will be attempted, before returning to a final test at the start/finish venue. Competitors who have not returned their Score Card to the finish by 5.15 p.m. may be excluded.

Route

Total route mileage will be detailed in the Final Instructions. Ordnance Survey Landranger 1:50,000 Map 117 Chester & Wrexham (edition D1) is strongly advised. Straightforward route instructions of the 'turn left, turn right' variety will be given, but the map will be a valuable safety net.

Classes

Class 1 Edwardian Cars Class 2 Light Cars Class 3 Cycle Cars

Technical Regulations

All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical regulations and with the VSCC's 'Eligibility of Cars (2002)' leaflet (or subsequent) and the requirements of the Light Car and Edwardian Section of the VSCC. All competing cars must be taxed (displaying the appropriate tax disc) and insured for use on the public highway. Insurance cover must include usage on this event. All cars must be in possession of a current and valid MOT certificate and this, as well as the tax disc, or other national equivalent documents, must be presented to the Scrutineers for inspection. No show, no go, no exceptions. All cars must carry a securely mounted fire extinguisher. N.B. Halon/BCF types are not allowed in the U.K. AFFF or Zero2000 standard are strongly advised. The VSCC do not allow powder.

Awards

Awards will be presented as follows:

- Named trophies: Colin Crabbe Trophy for best overall performance; Cyclecar Trophy for best performance by a cycle car.
- First, Second and Third class awards appropriate to the number of starters in each class.

Named trophies to be held for one year, others to be retained.

Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on **Friday 28th August**. The entry fee is £25 per car. If under 23 years old, the entry fee is £19. Discounts are available for the second drivers of shared cars, who may only drive on the test themselves: £19, or £15 if under 23 years old. Lunches, if required, must be pre-booked at £8.00 (main course) or £11.50 (main course + pudding) per head.

All entries must be made on the official Entry Form and accompanied by the correct fee. All entries must be sent by post to the Secretary to the Meeting:

The maximum entry for the meeting is 75 cars and the minimum is 15 cars. Should the minimum figure not be reached the organisers reserve the right to cancel the meeting or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be selected in order of receipt of entry form and fee. Entry fees will be refunded by notice to the Secretary of the Meeting no later than Friday 4th September.

Results

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the end of the event and in accordance with A.61. Any appeal or protest must be lodged in accordance with C(d) 45-59 and 60-80.

Identification

Competitors will be identified by Numbers supplied by the organiser, to be displayed at the front of the vehicle. These must be removed at the finish or on retirement from the event.

Autotests

Details of the tests together with marking and penalties will be issued at signing-on. Timing will be by hand-held stopwatch. The start signal will be the fall of a flag. The order of attempting tests will be notified at signing on. Practising will not be allowed.

Modification of the General Regulations

All other General Regulations of the MSA apply as written except for the following, which have been modified:
A car may be driven by two drivers on the Autotests, provided that a separate entry form is submitted for each driver, making it clear that the car is to be shared.

The VSCC Policy Statement

The Directors and trustees of The Vintage Sports-Car Club (VSCC or The Club) recognise and wholeheartedly accept their moral and legal obligations and responsibilities with regard to health, safety and the environment.

It is the Policy of the VSCC to operate in a positive culture of safety, health and environmental protection throughout its entire business and sporting activities. To this end the Club will coordinate all relevant activities under the collective heading of Safety, Health, Environment and Fire or 'SHEF'.

It is the policy of the VSCC to take all reasonably practicable steps to:

- Provide adequate control of the health, safety and environmental risks arising from our activities;
- Consult with our employees on matters affecting their health and safety;
- Provide and maintain safe plant and equipment;
- Ensure safe handling and use of substances;
- Provide information, instruction and supervision of employees;
- Ensure all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate training;
- Prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health;
- Maintain safe and healthy working conditions;
- Protect the health and safety of others who may be affected by our activities;
- Deal with waste and pollution in an environmentally responsible manner;
- Review and revise this policy as necessary at regular intervals.

In pursuance of this policy the Club will progressively identify all hazards, assess the risks and take measures to reduce risk. Motor sport is spectacular and exciting, providing enjoyment to competitors and spectators alike but there are many aspects of the sport which carry inherent risks. These risks cannot be totally eliminated and emphasis must therefore be placed on controlling the risks through effective risk management systems. The purpose of such Risk Management will be elimination of the risk where possible or reduction of the risks So Far As is Reasonably Practicable (SFARP) where it cannot.
